
First-Ever PortFest Receives Rave Reviews From The Community

Thousands attended the first-ever Port-Fest, an outdoor celebration of local artists and supporting creative arts education in Port Washington Public Schools.


The festival, which took place at Schreiber High School in Port Washington on Saturday, May 19, was made possible by the community organization, HEARTS (Helping Enrich the Arts).
